known in the community and beyond. Plans for club activities are slowly beginning to take shape and by the next meeting we will have something to report. Speaking of the next meeting, I was unable to reserve the room for the third Thursday (21st) and had to settle for the last Thursday in September.

THE NEXT MEETING OF THE DaVINCI WILL BE ON THE 28TH OF SEPTEMBER AT 7 P.M., NORTH BRANCH LIBRARY.

We are still searching for a new place to hold our meetings. The requirements are for a place large enough to hold events other than meetings (dances, parties, etc.), being able to use it with little or no advance notice, and using it whenever we need to (weekdays, weekends, day and evening). Most importantly, it must not cost the DaVinci anything. I know this sounds nearly impossible but places such as this do exist, we just need to make the right contact. If you have any ideas please contact any of the Senior Staff. Our officer corps is just about filled; only one position still remain vacant - Quartermaster. The requirements for the position are: willing to join Starfleet, attend Officers Training School (OTS), and have a flair for planning good times and fun. The position of Quartermaster is one of those "where-are-my-volunteers" position. The Quartermaster has the job of planning, organizing, and carrying

out ship functions outside the monthly meetings. This would include activities such as a Halloween party, Thanksgiving and/or Christmas dinners/parties, the monthly DaVinci night out, and any other such social functions, but does not include fund raising events such as bake sales and car washes. Right now, the Quartermaster will have help in planning and carrying out events, but as the DaVinci grows and more members become able volunteers, the Quartermaster will shoulder more and more of the responsibility. I need to clarify something that may be misunderstood. Although all of the officer positions are about to be filled, this does not mean any qualified member of the crew cannot be an officer in the DaVinci. The only requirements are you must join Starfleet, be 18 years old, and attend OTS. The reason for the age requirement is because Starfleet requires OTS applicants to be at least 18 years. Once you have attended OTS, you will be promoted to the rank of Ensign. If you are nearing your 18th birthday, have joined Starfleet, and have plans to take OTS when you turn 18, you will be made an acting Ensign until such time when all requirements are completed. Must you join Starfleet if you have no desire to become an officer? The answer is no. The DaVinci does not require its members to join Starfleet, but we hope that you will. Applications for Starfleet membership will be available at every DaVinci function and from your Division head. A list of the Senior staff is located on the last page of the newsletter. What about promotions? Promotions will be based primarily on how much you contribute to the ship through your volunteer work, attendance at meetings, etc. I realize that some members may not be able to attend all functions or be able to volunteer as much as they would like because of school, work, or family. In cases such as this, taking courses from Starfleet

Academy will be a good path to promotion. Promotions will not be automatic. You must be recommended for promotion by your Division head. The final authority for officer promotions within the DaVinci is myself. This authority for the Commander of a vessel to promote is granted by Starfleet. I have the authority to promote up to the rank of Commander. Captain and above are promoted by Starfleet. Enlisted promotions will be at the discretion of your Division Head and subject to my approval. We have not yet worked out all of the intricacies of an enlisted rank structure, but it will probably go from Petty Officer 3 (PO3) through Senior Chief Petty Officer (SCPO) to the highest enlisted rank, Master Chief Petty Officer (MCPO). Once we have selected a MCPO, this person will then become part of the Senior Staff and represent the concerns of all enlisted crew personnel. I had a few crew members come up to me after the first two meetings to inquire about uniforms and personas. Uniforms are only required for the Senior Staff and they must be Next Generation-era uniforms (Next Generation, Deep Space Nine, or Voyager). Everyone else can wear whatever uniform they desire (Original Series to Next Generation to alien to something you made up). I would like as many DaVinci personnel as possible to have uniforms, especially during events such as membership drives, the DaVinci night out, or volunteer work. It gets us noticed. I would recommend you call 1-800-TREKKER and ask to be sent one of their catalogues. As for personas, you can be anything you want to be in the DaVinci from Klingon to Andorian to Romulan. The important thing to remember is that no matter what persona you choose have fun with it, but do not go to the extreme and let it spoil your relationship with other DaVinci personnel. See y'all on the 28th!
