TREK BUZZ

Since its release, *Insurrection* has taken in \$100 million, about \$32 million of which is in foreign sales.

Since being named as one of *People Magazine's* 50 most beautiful people of 1997, Garrett Wang now has the opportunity to make a difference. His steady role on *Star Trek: Voyager* gives him the chance to show an Asian American in a non-stereotypical role, a rare opportunity in Hollywood.

This year's Hollywood Salutes Easter Seals special at UCLA's Freud Theater will present a Lifetime Achievement Award honoring *Star Trek* creator Gene Roddenberry. This solicitation-free event will salute the work of Easter Seals and of the entertainment industry's commitment to present stories about people with disabilities. The special will air nationwide the week of 27 March.

Deep Space Nine producer Ron Moore and his wife gave birth on January 26th to Robin Cooper Moore. Mom and son are doing well.

Patrick (Picard) Stewart is now filming his Christmas Carol movie for a Christmas 2000 airing on TNT.

Star Trek: The Experience is among nominees in this year's Golden Reel Awards by the Motion Picture Sound Editors. Experience is nominated in the category of Special Venues

Experience introduced wedding packages with four weddings on Valentine's Day. Wedding packages, which begin at \$2000, take place on the bridge with the reception at Quark's.

Vidiot's Star Trek site noted recently that Voyager is being offered for sale into daily syndication for airings beginning this fall.

Armin (Quark) Shimerman noted that he is working on another SF novel entitled The Merchant Prince.

Here's a quick follow-up and confirmation regarding whether or not Paramount is actively considering development of another Star Trek series. In short, there have been further strong and reliable indications that Paramount is keenly interested in developing a new Trek series to fill the ugly void left by Star Trek: Deep Space Nine's forthcoming conclusion. At this time, there is still no indication as to what form such a series would actually take. There is some indication that such decisions may have already been made, or that a general "approach" to the series has now been established.

Finally, a little about the current status of Star Trek X: It will most likely be the last TNG film, since several actors have expressed an interest in finishing up. Most notably, Brent Spiner has stated that as he is becoming older, Data should not, so Spiner wants Data killed off in the next film. Anything you hear at this point about the film is conjecture. Apparently, Patrick Stewart, Rick Berman, et al held a preliminary meeting to discuss possible options for the next film. The film may include a story line with the Romulans - but again, this is purely conjecture.
