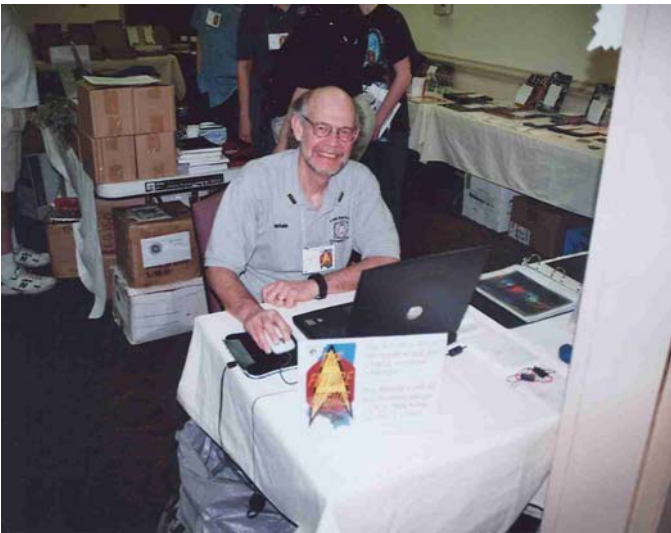

Slowly throughout the day, folks from the DaVinci as well other chapters began to arrive. It was one big family reunion!

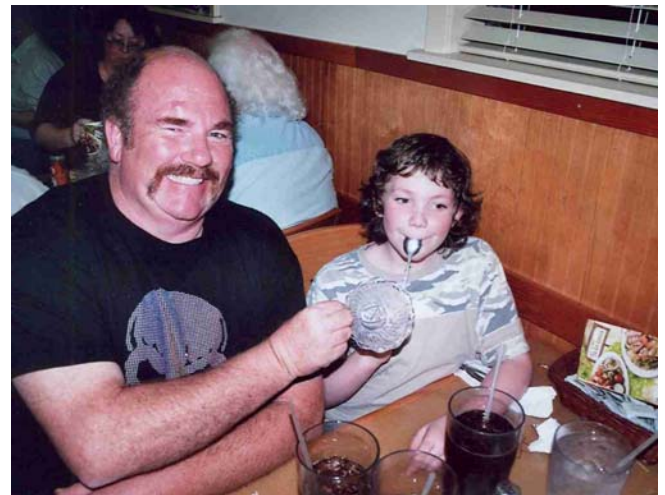

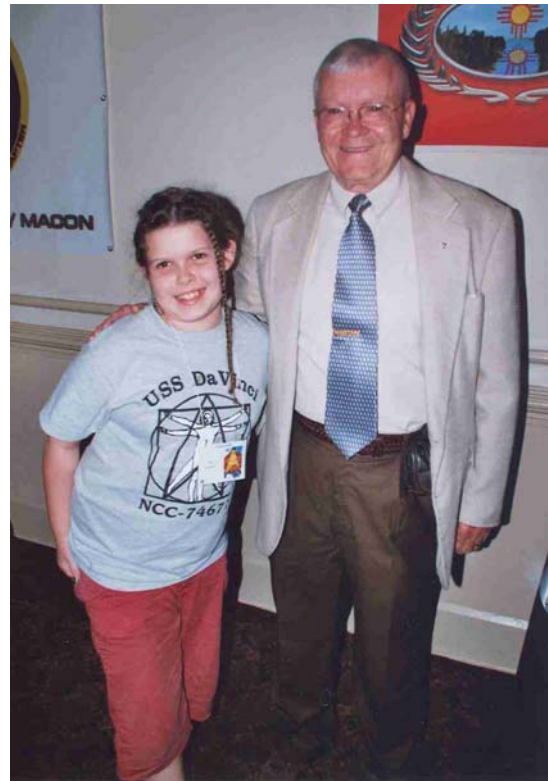

The USS DaVinci at the Opening Ceremony

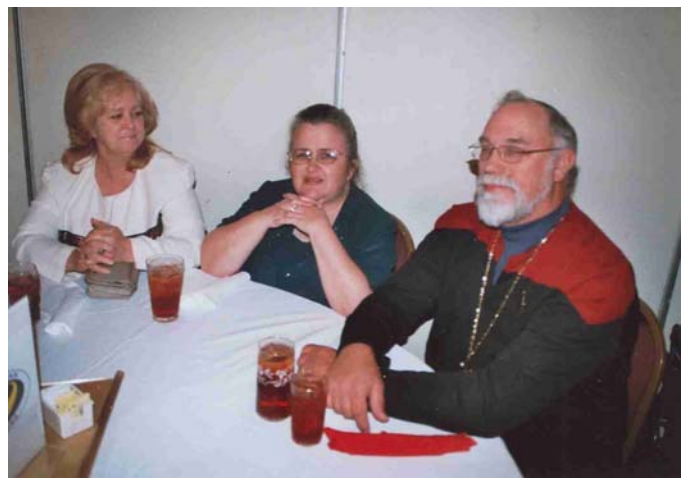

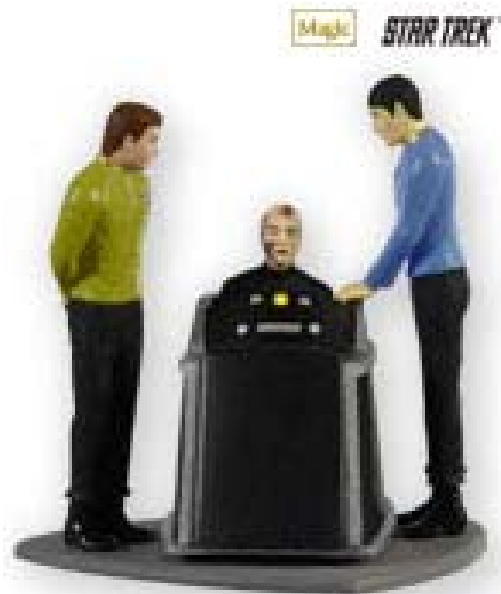

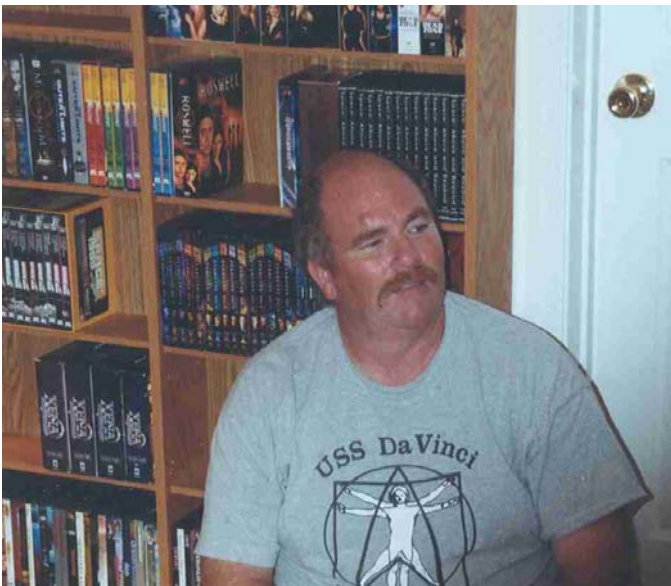
