

PASSAGES

We are saddened to report the passing of Barrie Ingham, the British actor whose many credits included a guest role on Star Trek: The Next Generation. Ingham passed away on January 23, just a few weeks shy of his 83rd birthday. His turn in the Star Trek universe came with the episode "Up the Long Ladder," which cast him as Danilo Odell, leader of the Bringloldi, who didn't care for the sythenol whiskey aboard the Enterprise, but was quite pleased to have to mate with three women to create a new genetic pool. Well before "Up the Long Ladder," Ingham was actually among those considered for the role of Jean-Luc Picard.

Ingham spent decades in the acting business, working on the stage (in the West End and on Broadway), on television and in films, with his credits spanning from the 1950's to 2014. He acted alongside Dame Judi Dench in 16 plays over the years, often taught acting as well and as recently as last year starred in a one-man show, Keep Calm and Sing On. Among his many films and television projects were The Victorians, Doctor Who, The Avengers, The Day of the Jackal, The Great Mouse Detective (for which he voiced Basil of Baker Street/Bartholomew) and The Triangle.

The actor passed away, "peacefully at home," following a short illness, according to a statement from his family. He leaves behind his wife of more than 50 years, Tarne Phillips, and four children, as well as several grandchildren.

CARE AND FEEDING OF IDOLS: A Review of Love Live! School Idol Festival

Love Live! School Idol Festival is a free rhythm game from KLab Games, available on both Apple and Android platforms. It is based upon *Love Live! School Idol Project*, a Japanese money-making juggernaut offering manga, anime, CDs, concerts, action figures, and even an

upcoming theatrical movie. I was introduced to it by Wendy, my work partner, who is SO MUCH more anime/manga geeky than I am, and now my family is researching intervention strategies.

The story line is that a group of students in Japan have formed a school idol band to increase their school's popularity. You are introduced to the nine main characters and given the task of recruiting more students and overseeing the music practices and performances ("Live Shows"). Students are represented by virtual collector cards, featuring the singers in various costumes. Each student's biography reveals her personality, skills and quirks. There is an extremely high cute factor to these cards and costumes, and cosplay fodder potential is high. These cards are collected in your virtual album, unless you "sell" them off.

Success in the game is an incestuous combination of three components: story, practice, and performance. Your personal advancement in the game is a mixture of luck, skill, and how much time you are willing to invest in it. An optional addition is the spending of real-world money to gain extra playing time and/or higher ranking idols--not something in which I participate!

The story is revealed to you based upon certain ranks or achievements. Completion of story portions provides you with currency to improve your team members and recruit new ones. Practicing your team members increases their abilities, which provides higher Live Show scores. Live Shows pay you in currency and new students. Performing your team members increases their bond with the others, and when maximum bond is reached, you can open more stories and gain more currency. See how it is all mixed together?

The actual game play is hitting moving circles as they advance toward the characters on stage. There are singles, doubles, and holds, and then there are those nasty "stars" that deduct stamina points if you don't do it exactly right. All of this is done to the beat of perky J-pop songs. When you touch the circles, you hear a sound based upon how accurately you hit it; the sound reminds me of tambourines, and I really hate the "CLINK" when I don't hit it at "great" or "perfect".

In addition to regular play, two different ten-day events are scheduled each month. The token event has players collect tokens in each Live Show, which are cashed in to play the event song and gain points towards various rewards. By the end of this event you generally hate the event song because you have played it for TEN STRAIGHT DAYS. The score match event matches you with random players to compete head-to-head on random songs. Your placement in each score match directly affects the number of event points you receive for the song. In both events, rewards are given at various point levels and include gold, friend points, love gems, and special event cards. There are also event rewards based upon how you rank among all players worldwide.

I would be remiss if I did not warn you of a slight sleaze factor. While the game is cute and girly, a large number of the players are male. Many have formed obsessions over these digital singers, and events can be quite competitive if their favorite is one of the rewards. These are usually the players who spend (obscene amounts of) real world money on a free game to purchase love gems for Honor Student scouting and for additional playing time. This means that during Score Match events you can set a personal record on a song, yet still lose to players who have packed a team with high-ranking cards.

Here is my experience: I spend more time setting up the teams and getting the characters trained than actually playing the songs and hitting the targets. I keep track of who I have in my collection, who needs to be leveled or bonded up, and who is expendable. This game can be viewed at such levels of complexity that a breakdown of its strategy could parallel in-depth business plans.

I do warn you that if you start playing, you will find that your rank rises quite quickly at first. However, each rank requires more experience than the last to get to the next level. If you run out of live points before you have run out of desire to play one more game, you are hooked, and the waiting game begins: it takes six minutes to gain one live point and games cost 4-25 points, based upon difficulty.








USS DAVINCI IN PICTURES


