

## PASSAGES

Karen Montgomery, who played Beata, the Elected One mistress of Angel I in the Star Trek: The Next Generation first season episode "Angel One", died 4 December of breast cancer. Footage from this episode was later reused for the second season episode "Shades of Gray".



Montgomery started acting in the late 1970s when she portrayed Patricia in the Kojak episode "In Full Command" (1978). In the following years she had featured and supporting parts in the comedy *Going in Style* (1979), the drama *Coast to Coast* (1980), the television movie *Condor* (1986), and the science fiction comedy *Amazon Women on the Moon* (1987). Montgomery also guest starred in episodes of *Nero Wolfe* (1981), *Aloha Paradise* (1981), and *L.A. Law* (1993).

Since her last known on-screen acting job in *L.A. Law* in 1991, Montgomery has worked as producer on several projects. She was an associate producer on the thriller *Diary of a Hitman* (1991) and on the comedy *'Til There Was You* (1997), a co-producer on the crime drama *Row Your Boat* (1999), and a producer on the documentaries *Special Thanks to Roy London* (2005), and *A Sense of Wonder* (2008).

According to the trade paper *Variety*, Montgomery is survived by her husband, director Christopher Monger; her mother; Susan Nelson; and brother, Carl Montgomery. Please join in extending condolences to Montgomery's family, friends, associates, and fans.

Penny L. Juday died on 19 December following a battle with cancer. She was theart department coordinator, an archivist who was responsible for managing props, set pieces, models, blueprints, photographs, and many other parts of Star Trek history. She has cataloged everything on the Paramount Pictures lot relating to Star Trek, and was the first source production designers or set dressers approach when a piece of information or a certain object was needed. Juday also worked as shopper for the productions including Deep Space Nine and located several set pieces and props used on the show on the countryside.



Juday has been frequently interviewed for the special features on Star Trek DVDs, and often provided glimpses into the vault of Star Trek memorabilia housed at Paramount. She has also managed the History of the Future museum at Star Trek: The Experience in Las Vegas, Nevada. In addition, Juday worked as Project Coordinator for Star Trek: The Magazine and as Researcher for the Star Trek Fact Files, contributing photos and information to the technical briefings in both.

She had a small cameo appearance as a civilian of the USS Enterprise-D in Star Trek Generations. She is seen sitting at a table at the beginning of the scene and later leaves the bar, when Picard enters. A good image of her in costume is included in the photo gallery of the Star Trek Generations (Special Edition) DVD set. Ensign Penny Juday, an obscure name on a casualty list glimpsed during DS9: "In the Pale Moonlight", was named for her.

Juday married former Star Trek: Deep Space Nine and Star Trek: Enterprise scenic artist Anthony Fredrickson, after some gentle prodding by Denise Okuda.

Juday's non-Trek credits included On Deadly Ground, Alien: Resurrection, NCIS and You Don't Mess with the Zohan, and she was an animal lover who rescued many cats and kittens through her organization, Paw Haven, which was linked to Precious Paws. She lived in Indiana and is survived by her husband, Anthony Fredrickson, a former scenic artist on both Deep Space Nine and Enterprise.

I saw Penny at numerous conventions and it is there we became good friends. Most of my Star Trek props were obtained from Penny either through auctions or direct sale. All of the monies she collected went into her cat rescue organization. Even after she left the business and moved to Indiana we kept in touch. I shall miss her dearly.







## MORE NEWS YOU CAN USE!

There's a new store open here in town and Chris and myself hit the place up to check it out. The store, 2<sup>nd</sup> and Charles is, in a word, amazing. On the outside it kind of reminded us of Books A Million because they had mobile shelves up with books on them like Books A Million used to do. Once we walked in though we realized almost instantly that this store was a different monster altogether. Firstly there was a trade-in counter where you can bring your old books, CDs, DVDs, and records. Since it was our first visit we didn't have any with us but usually for trade-ins like that you either get cash or store credit, not sure exactly which they offer but just the fact that they have a trade-in station at all sets it apart from Books A Million and Barnes and Noble. The differences did not stop there though. A quick look around revealed that, while they do have a

massive book selection, they have a lot of other things there as well. It's a Nerds dream store. Quite literally there is something there for everyone.

If you like Anime there is a section for that. Manga? Yep, there is a section for that as well and at fairly reasonable prices. Star Trek and Star Wars books as well as other memorabilia were in abundance as well (in fact I'm considering going back to get my dad something Trekkie since he's a huge fan). If you love games then you are going to drool - a lot. Because they have a game section that carries everything from Nintendo, (Yes, Vanilla Nintendo, as in the original NES system) to PlayStation 4 and everything in-between. It was pretty sweet to browse through the isles of that section. They even have after-market console systems that allow you to run Nintendo, Super Nintendo, etc cartridges.

There are two huge, and I mean massively huge, televisions with a game console hooked up to each of them which brings in the possibility of them maybe having game tournaments or something (not too sure but the possibilities are there) but the chairs in front of both televisions are comfortable and a really good place to have a seat and relax after browsing through the huge store.

If you have a record player and are a fan of the old vinyl's you might want to make a stop in there because they had a large selection of those as well. There were movies (I found Police Academy 1-3 which I had been looking for and hadn't been able to find anywhere else), a music (CD) section, and a selection of t-shirts too.

After spending a couple of hours finding a treasure trove of items it was finally time to check out. They didn't have any of the plastic bags like you get at Walmart or other shopping stores so if you end up buying quite a bit, I recommend bringing your own bag from home or you can buy one of the re-useable bags that they offer. All in all it's a great store with a massive selection so if you have the time go in and check it out if you haven't found it by the time you read this. It's well worth a single visit and once you enter you may never want to leave. I sure didn't.




## USS DAVINCI IN PICTURES
