

PASSAGES

StarTrek.com is saddened to report the passing of Don Marshall, who played Lt. Boma -- the astrophysicist who clashed with his superior officer, Spock -- in the Star Trek: The Original Series episode "The Galileo Seven." The actor also made his mark in several other sci-fi projects; he was a regular on the series Land of the Giants, co-starred with Rosie Grier and Ray Milland in the cult classic film The Thing with Two Heads, and guest starred on The Bionic Woman, Buck Rogers in the 25th Century and The Incredible Hulk. According to a statement posted on Facebook by Barbara Luna, Marshall's longtime friend, fellow TOS guest and fellow frequent convention attendee, the actor, who was 80, "passed away at Cedars Sinai Hospital on Sunday evening October 30, at approximately 8:00 PM. Don transitioned peacefully; at his bedside were his daughter, son, and twin brother Doug Marshall. A memorial service is to be determined."



StarTrek.com spoke to Marshall back in 2012. During the wide-ranging conversation, Marshall addressed one of the most-impactful aspects of his appearance on TOS, which was that Lt. Boma's skin color meant nothing in the scheme of the episode. "That was beautiful. That was Gene Roddenberry, and I'd worked for him once before. I did an episode of The Lieutenant for him," Marshall said, referring to "To Set It Right," a controversial, racially charged hour that also featured Gary Lockwood, Dennis Hopper and, in her television acting debut, Nichelle Nichols as the fiancée of Marshall's character. "That's the way the guy was. He didn't see color. He saw situation and he had a vision, more so than most people. You could really see that with Star Trek. People learned from Star Trek. This guy created something special. A lot of people went into

engineering because of Star Trek. I've been told that by many, many engineers. People became astronauts and went into the space program because of the show. You look back and you think, 'What a visionary Gene was,' or 'What a beautiful person he was.' I wish everybody was that way, but of course we don't have that."

Please join all Star Trek fans in offering condolences to Marshall's family, friends, colleagues and fans.

SCIENCE STATION

Hi all, this month we are going to look at NOAA, our weather trackers that keep us safe, and informed when the weather does not decide to cooperate with our plans. First, back in August NOAA released a new generation of satellites, GOES. GOES had an upgrade to GOES-R. This means there will be more real time videos, snap shots, and it even goes further than its predecessor by tracking lighting patterns. What does this mean for us? Well it gives a HD, 3D look at weather in real time, of weather from around the globe. Also, it will give greater warning times, and path predictions of storms, hurricanes, and tornados. With tornados the more time the more lives to be saved.

Next, let us look at the discovery deep space satellite. This new tool will look at the weather on earth, as well as the solar weather from the sun, like solar storms, and magnetic flares. Its goal is to be able to track any potentially hazardous weather from the sun that could impact our infrastructure, economy and life here on earth. It keeps Lagrange path of 1 and is in a zero orbit for that reason. So as we proceed thru the years we should start to see a more correct, and visual look at the patterns of our climate as well as a more accurate prediction of upcoming storms and hurricanes. So with the new tech, hurricanes like that of Matthew, tsunamis, and solar flare storms that could damage, or destroy infrastructure can be caught early. The risk to life, property can be minimized all the way around.

KLINGON LANGUAGE (tlhIngan' Hol)

Having spent many years now on earth learning its customs, the language and the culture, it has come to my attention that a number of Terrans are interested in learning the Klingon language, our customs and our culture. Some of our mannerisms are present in our language. Klingons are very blunt and do not waste time with formalities such as saying “please” and “thank you”. Such is the case when we greet each by saying, “nuqneH” (nuke-‘nech), which roughly translates, “What do you want?”

If you’ve been thinking about learning how to speak Klingon, now is the time. There are plenty of resources out there to teach you everything you need to know. I would, however, start by keeping a good supply of napkins or paper towels handy as you will find speaking Klingon can be, well, messy. Once you learn how to pronounce the Klingon alphabet the rest is a piece of fresh gagH, I mean cake.

If you want to use your computer to go online to find some resources, I would suggest tuning to subspace frequency <http://kli.org> . This is the home page of the Klingon Language Institute and has a plethora of information on the Klingon language including language courses. Also you can find information on the latest works at hand and previous works such as The Complete Works of Shakespeare and the Bible translated to Klingon. As you may know, you’ve not heard Shakespeare until you’ve heard it in Klingon. taH pagh taHbe! (To be or not to be!)

There are also a few Klingon translators online. Some good, some not so good. You must be careful of some translators because if certain words or phrases are said or spoken incorrectly it can start an intergalactic war of which would be disastrous. One of the better translators I have found is located at subspace frequency <https://www.translator.eu/english/klingon/translation/>.

If you’re not much of a tech person then I would suggest buying a copy of The Klingon Dictionary by Mark Okrand, a master linguist who “introduced”, to put it in layman’s terms, the Klingon language to the Terrans of Earth. Also copies of How To Speak Klingon on CD are obtainable by checking with your local bookstore or consulting eBay.








USS DAVINCI IN PICTURES
