



The following Saturday was the DaVinci’s 22nd annual participation in the Help-the-Hooch River clean-up sponsored by the Keep Columbus Beautiful Commission. For the last several years the turn-out for the Help-the-Hooch River clean-up has been low and this year was no different. Only five folks showed up on a pleasant Saturday morning to help clean up a portion of the RiverWalk behind Rigdon Park in South Columbus. As it has been for years we only cleaned up a very small section of the RiverWalk just behind the Riverwind Apartments on what has become know to us as “The Hill”. It seems that the folks who live in the Riverwind apartment complex believe that the hill behind them is their private dumping ground. Every year we find enough trash to fill up several large trash bags. This year was worse than usual as we filled up four and a half bags of trash. Some of the items found were dirty diapers (ugh), shoes, toys, a metal mattress frame, mini blinds, and tons of plastic and glass items. We also found 126 aluminum cans which we saved so that I could take them home to recycle. Of course, we usually find some interesting objects and this year was no different. This year the honor of finding the



PASSAGES

Celeste Yarnall was an actress from Long Beach, California who played Martha Landon in the Star Trek: The Original Series episode "The Apple" has died at the age of 74. The cause of death was ovarian cancer. Diagnosed with "high-grade stage 3" ovarian cancer back in 2014, she had surgery and chemo and other treatments. She went into remission for four years, but sadly the cancer returned.

Her other television credits include appearances on Bewitched, The Man from U.N.C.L.E., Bonanza, Land of the Giants, and Melrose Place.

Yarnall made her feature film debut in the 1963 comedy The Nutty Professor, in which she played a college student. In 1968, she co-starred in the film The Face of Eve. She followed this with roles in the Elvis Presley film Live a Little, Love a Little in 1968 and the Academy Award-nominated comedy Bob & Carol & Ted & Alice in 1969.

In 1972, Yarnall had a role in the Charles Bronson action film The Mechanic and in 1973, she co-starred in the film Scorpio. More recent film credits include 1987's Fatal Beauty, Funny About Love (directed by Leonard Nimoy), and 1993's Born Yesterday.

Among her other distinctions, Yarnall was also the last woman to be elected as an original "Miss Rheingold," in 1964.

Yarnall was offered a choice by casting director Joseph D'Agosta that she either plays the yeoman in the upcoming episode, "The Apple" or waits until a more substantial guest role would be available for her, probably costuming her up as an alien beauty, making full use of her looks. Yarnall chose the first option, because she liked the script and the part, and was worried if she might miss that promised other chance. She wore Grace Lee Whitney's uniform in the episode, which was re-fitted for her. (These Are the Voyages: TOS Season Two)

In 2009, Yarnall guest voiced the role of T'Pol on the fan-produced series Star Trek: The Continuing Mission.

Yarnall is survived by husband Nazim, daughter Cami (Stephen Forte), and her granddaughter Gaby.

NEWS YOU CAN USE!

The new rates for membership in Starfleet are in place and are a pretty good deal. NOTE: There are no more paper memberships available. All memberships are electronic (via email). If you are thinking of joining Fleet but the expense was too high now you can get your membership for much less money. Not only will you save money there, but your membership in the DaVinci is half off as well (up to a \$7.50 savings!) and you are automatically promoted to Acting Ensign! The new Starfleet membership rates are: Individual - \$5; Family of 2 - \$9; Family of 3 - \$12; Family of 4 - \$14; Family of 5 - \$16; and Family of 6 - \$17. Paper membership certificates are no longer available – all memberships are now completely digital. However, if you wish a paper certificate it will cost you \$3.00 for each one plus shipping. If you want a printed copy of the Starfleet handbook it will cost you \$8.00 plus shipping. If you are not in Starfleet, please give some thought about joining this great organization!
