

ON THE HOLDDECK

Music has always been a key part of Star Trek. The theme song to the original series is iconic, and is echoed in the theme to 'The Next Generation.' While the music in the opening credits of subsequent Star Trek series didn't stick quite so close to the original theme, the music is still immediately recognizable to fans.

But there's more to music than just Star Trek theme songs. Most of us enjoy listening to a wide variety of auditory delights. In May I asked for your favorite space themed songs, and I've narrowed down the resulting list to some tunes I'm sure we all can appreciate.

We shall start with songs from sci-fi soundtracks. The Vitamin String Quartet has released tribute albums to both Star Wars and Star Trek featuring covers of music from the soundtracks. Both are well worth purchasing.

"The Battle Begins" is from the 1980 movie "Battle Beyond the Stars." While I can't speak for the quality of the film, the song itself is a lovely instrumental.

We've all seen Stargate, right? (I will assume the answer is "yes." If you said "no" be sure to check out both the movie and first TV series.) One song from the film stands out; "Ra – The Sun God" is an ominous instrumental with palpable tension.

"Space Stallions" is a "fake 80's cartoon" short created by The Animation Workshop. The music video is very nostalgic and typical of that era considering it was created in 2012.

"Star Trekkin;" by The Firm is a must-listen classic. This song is the ultimate earworm that'll leave you humming "...Ye cannae change the laws of physics, laws of physics, laws of physics..." for hours.

Equally catchy is "The Saga Begins" by Weird Al Yankovic. This Star Wars Episode One parody is set to the tune of "American Pie" (by Don Mclean). The chorus is very catchy, beginning

with, "Oh my, my this here Anakin guy; Maybe Vader someday later, now he's just a small fry..."

Perhaps the ultimate combined Star Trek and Star Wars tribute is Aurelio Voltaire's 'BiTrektual' album. Some of the songs get a bit raunchy, such as "The Sexy Data Tango," but the music is overall good. There are even guest appearances by Tim Russ (Tuvok), Garrett Wang (Ens. Kim), and Robert Picardo (The Doctor). There are two versions of the title track. One featuring Jason C. Miller (formerly of Godhead), and an alternate version with Robert Picardo. This is a must-have album for fans with a naughty sense of humor. (Seriously, don't let the kids listen until you've heard for yourself which songs are "safe" for tiny ears.)

"Rocket Ride" by Tom Smith is a tribute to the sci-fi genre that's well worth a listen. Smith is a filk musician known as "The World's Fastest Filker" for his improvisational skills.

Speaking of rockets, Elton John's "Rocket Man" is one of the more mainstream hits that fits our space theme. "Space Oddity" by David Bowie is another classic, as is Bowie's "Starman." All three of these songs conjure images of spaceships against a twinkling void.

"Come Take A Trip In My Airship" is a song originally performed in 1904 by J.W. Myers, composed by George "Honey Boy" Evans, with lyrics by Ren Shields. It's about a couple "sailing" through the clouds on an airship, through the stars, around Venus and Mars, ending with a visit to the Man in the Moon. It's a chipper little song that's been performed by multiple people over the century, including Johnny Cash and Natalie Merchant. Most recently Abney Park covered it as part of their "New Nostalgics" album.

Abney Park has two other songs with a space theme. "Deep In Space" is about a spaceship that comes across a planet that has been ravaged by the dominant intelligent species to the point of near-ruin. The music video features scenes from Earth as viewed by the ship's crew. This is a song intended to make the listener Think. The other space song from this band is far more light-hearted. "Christmas From Space" is a holiday themed song that tells of Santa's spacefaring adventure.

"Stairway to the Stars" has been performed by many artists, but most notably by Ella Fitzgerald in 1939. The song feels of old-time romanticism that still charms listeners today.

Marvin Gaye even gets in on these space-themed songs with "Funky Space Reincarnation." The song is a jazz/funk number that tells of a man who travels in space and time on a "space bed," and encounters a woman who reminds him of his first wife.

"Space & Time" by VNV nation is another "travel through space and time" themed song, only in this case the individual is lost. The meaning of this song is not quite so clear-cut, but it's an enjoyable listen.

"Stars Align" by violinist Lindsey Stirling features very few words. In fact, "when the stars align" is the only vocalization. The song combines Stirling's skilled violin playing with the

electric-techno accompaniment in an energetic space-themed frenzy.

"Fire In The Sky" by Kristoph Klover is perhaps the ultimate history of space travel in musical form. The melody is powerful, and the words inspire both triumph and despair as Klover sings about some of the greatest accomplishments and disasters of human space travel. The song ends on a high note, calling for continued efforts to explore the universe beyond Earth's atmosphere.

The album "To Touch The Stars," which includes the aforementioned song, is entirely about space exploration. The album features musical celebrations of spaceflight from a variety of artists, and is well worth adding to your own music library.

"Starlight Brigade" by TWRP tells the tale of a young alien who finds a starship, joins a group of other starship pilots, and defeats a powerful enemy. The music video is a delight for the eyes as well as the ears.

"Spaceboy" is a song by Doctor Steel, a steampunk artist with an industrial hip hop style. Who doesn't love watching a mad scientist rap about a boy playing "spaceman" in a cardboard spaceship in the back yard?

Our final song isn't exactly space-themed, but I couldn't resist including it. "Magic Carpet Ride" by Steppenwolf secured it's spot by being the song Zefram Cochrane listened to as he blasted off to break the Warp barrier for the first time. That historical flight attracted the attention of some passing Vulcans, leading to First Contact between humans and an alien species. The events surrounding the event can be viewed in the movie "Star Trek: First Contact."


